1. Be a graduate of an Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE)-accredited Doctor of Pharmacy degree program
2. Be eligible for licensure in the state of TN
3. Submit a detailed letter of interest, current curriculum vitae, official pharmacy school transcripts, and three letters of recommendation through the Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application Service (PhORCAS®) website at www.ashp.org/phorcas
4. Participate in the ASHP Resident Matching Program
