Thank you for your interest in the PGY2 Critical Care Residency Program at Saint Joseph Hospital! As you begin the process of PGY2 program investigation, I'm sure that Saint Joseph will present an exciting option for your consideration. We offer a challenging environment for prospective residents who enjoy the rounding atmosphere of an academic medical center with the close interpersonal relationships of a community hospital.

At Saint Joseph, clinical pharmacy is an integral part of the medical team. As such, we round on a daily basis with intensivists, physician extenders, nursing, case management, and dietitians. Our rounding model is comprehensive and designed to treat the patient as a whole and go in a "head to toe" fashion. As the drug expert in attendance, clinical pharmacy is responsible for all pharmaceutical care including: pharmacokinetic consults, antimicrobial selection and stewardship, renal dose adjustment, profile review and maintenance, laboratory result interpretation, therapy selection, home medication review, patient and family counseling, electrolyte replacement, and code response. On our team, communication is vital and as the clinical pharmacist, you can expect to be in constant contact with various members of the care team. With our progressive protocols in place, our clinical pharmacists are provided the autonomy to intervene as a matter of policy.

Residents at Saint Joseph are provided a strong foundation with core learning experiences focusing on cardiothoracic surgery, coronary critical care, medical intensive care, neurology intensive care, infectious diseases, emergency medicine, and palliative care. Additionally we offer elective learning experiences in the realm of cardiac electrophysiology, as well as advanced selective opportunities in our core learning experiences. We provide this training in the setting of a tradition of excellence as Saint Joseph Hospital has been recognized as one of America's 100 Best Hospitals by Healthgrades placing it in the top 2 percent of hospitals in the country. Additionally, Saint Joseph has been recognized as a top 2 percent facility in the nation for critical care for 3 years in a row. Saint Joseph is also recognized by the Joint Commission as a Gold Seal of Approval facility in the treatment of sepsis.

Introduction

SAINT JOSEPH HOSPITAL

As the largest facility in CHI Saint Joseph Health, Saint Joseph Hospital is Lexington's first hospital, a 433-bed acute care and surgical facility, founded in 1877. A wide variety of critical care and specialty services are provided utilizing 50 intensive care unit beds (a 22-bed cardiothoracic vascular unit, a 12-bed coronary/pulmonary care unit, a 6-bed neurology unit, and a 10-bed medical/surgical unit), as well as a 35-bed emergency department. The facility also provides over 150 telemetry beds, including dedicated units for cardiothoracic surgery step down and interventional cardiology care, among others. Pharmacy services are provided in both a centralized and decentralized manner by a variety of specialized pharmacists (staff, clinical, medication reconciliation, informatics, residents) and technical staff. Strong relationships and collaboration with award-winning healthcare professionals are utilized to provide the highest level of patient-centered care.

Program Overview

The PGY2 Critical Care Residency Program at Saint Joseph Hospital is a one year training curriculum focused in a variety of different critical care practice settings. The residency provides goal-oriented practice environments through a variety of experiences in critical care, cardiothoracic surgery, cardiology, infectious diseases, and emergency medicine to name a few. Most learning experiences feature a multidisciplinary rounding model where residents refine interdisciplinary teamwork and leadership skills. Graduates of the PGY2 program will possess the skills necessary to be highly competitive for a variety of career opportunities and will also be prepared to obtain specialty board certification.



Learning Experiences (Cont.)

TEACHING/PRECEPTING:

Residents will be given a variety of teaching opportunities including participation in a certificate of teaching and learning program, weekly clinical conferences, as well as coordinate and lead educational in-services for pharmacy, nursing, and medical staff. Residents will have the opportunity to co-precept pharmacy students from local colleges.

RESEARCH/CONFERENCES/PUBLICATION:

Residents will complete a clinical based research project including IRB submission, data collection and analysis, poster preparation, and manuscript writing. Residents will attend and present their research at the ASHP Midyear Clinical Meeting. Residents will also have the opportunity to attend the Society of Critical Care Medicine annual meeting.

PRACTICE MANAGEMENT/COMMITTEE INVOLVEMENT:

Practice management and administrative skills will be developed longitudinally with residents participating in protocol and policy development, medication use evaluations, quality improvement initiatives, and formulary management. Residents will attend and participate in several committee meetings including but not limited to the pharmacy and therapeutics committee and critical care committee.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS:


We incorporate community service events into our curriculum as a way to build camaraderie, integrate our lives into the Lexington community, and develop servant leadership skills.






